The doctor should have ruled out every possibility that could have caused the symptoms with various tests until a definite diagnosis could be determined. In 2006, a New York Times article calculated that about 20% of every diagnosis involving a deadly illness is wrongly diagnosed.

Common Illnesses That Are Wrongfully Diagnosed

The most common illnesses that are wrongfully diagnosed include:

- Cancer
- Heart Disease
- Strokes
- Blood Clots
- Meningitis
- Diabetes

In order to win your case, patients must have experienced some type of harm or loss. For example, pain and suffering, high medical costs, loss of wages, and or loss of the ability to enjoy life the way they use to prior to their wrongful diagnosis injury.
