project to be developed on the ground leased site is a commercial project, which could include a world-class clean technology center suitable for light manufacturing, research, office use, and/or a business development center focused in the areas of renewable energy and watertechnology. Respondents are encouraged to include within the project a public purpose related to water and energy education, work force development, and new technology development. Plans may also include retail and other commercial uses consistent with the area's market demands. All plans must incorporate sustainable principles and water and energy conservation measures, including a potential option for integrating solar power generation facilities into the project to allow the MWD to offset its energy demands at its Weymouth Treatment Plant in La Verne. Respondents may elect to assemble a team that brings together the necessary relevant development experience in the above areas. However, the lead developer of a multi-entity respondent must be an established firm currently in business with 15 years of experience in commercial real estate development. Respondents must provide evidence of recent directly-related experience in planning, designing, financing, building, and operating similar projects.
