Survey: 'durability' ranked first in green attributes

According to a new survey commissioned by PPG Industries, durability is the most important green building attribute. Durability was followed by ENERGY STAR compliance, life-cycle assessment, no- or low-volatile organic compound content and the ability to source products regionally. Additionally, durability is the most important attribute among building products in general, ranking slightly ahead of price.

Seattle leads in LEED buildings

In 2008, Seattle was recognized as the nation's leader in LEED-certified buildings by the USGBC, culminating an eight-year-old sustainable building policy. The Seattle policy requires all city-funded projects to be certified as LEED silver. Also, the city has an impressive bike trails system, a community-based home energy efficiency program, and a climate initiative. Seattle has set a target to reduce greenhouse gas emissions to 7% below 1990 levels by 2012. LEED-certified buildings in Seattle include the City Hall, the Central Library, McCaw Performance Hall and the Seattle Justice Center.

National Resources Defense Council - May 16

Independent Bank's 2,500-square-foot branch in Germantown, Memphis, is believed to be the first West Tennessee building to achieve LEED certification. Independent Bank's cost increased by about 5% through the LEED process, but the architect for the project believes the building will be 21% more energy efficient than a similar traditional building.

Evanston considers green building "deposit" law

Evanston, Illinois is proposing a new Green Building Ordinance. The ordinance requires builders to deposit a portion of the cost of their projects – which will be refunded upon achieving LEED certification.

USGBC explores multi-building certification

The USGBC pilot program certifies several buildings with a single application. This pilot program was launched in November 2006 and currently has 40 companies with 1,745 buildings. The USGBC hopes to bring the portfolio program out of the pilot phase during the third quarter of 2009.

Greenest college housing facility

Daily Nexus - May 19

UCSB's San Clemente Village is now the most sustainable housing facility of all U.S. college campuses according to the USGBC. The complex earned a LEED Gold rating.

First LEED-EBOM Gold office buildings

BusinessWire - May 19

Watt Plaza, a complex of two 23-story office towers encompassing 900,000 square feet in the heart of Century City, California is the first office building to achieve LEED Gold for existing buildings in the area of operations and maintenance (LEED-EBOM).

First LEED platinum athletic complex

WCTV - May 20

The \$28 million addition to the University of Florida's Ben Hill Griffin Stadium, has achieved LEED Platinum. The Complex is the first building in Florida and the first athletic facility in the nation to achieve platinum status.
