

How to Find the Best Court Reporting Services in Houston

When looking for <u>court reporting services</u> in Houston, Texas, an attorney has a wide range of options to consider. Do they want to hire a freelance court reporter, or will a larger <u>litigation support</u> firm provide the best person for the job? The part played by <u>court reporters</u> isn't a minor one; their ability to accurately transcribe testimony during <u>depositions</u> and other court proceedings is critical to the attorney being able to effectively represent their client.

Where to Start Looking

Virtually all court reporters and court reporting firms these days have an established presence on the internet, so opening a web browser window is a great place to start. Attorneys and support staff can narrow down search results based on their particular needs and preferences, resulting in a shorter list of qualified firms to choose from.

Ask the Right Questions

Once this has been established, lawyers can start digging into the qualifications of each court reporting firm on their list. A few areas of inquiry for attorneys to consider are:

- Experience and Qualification: How much experience does the court reporting services provider have? How much of that experience is in the particular field required for this case? Can the court reporting firm provide references?
- Communication Skills: When speaking with individual court reporting firms, how articulate are their client services staff? Court reporting is all about accurate communication, and a court reporting firm that doesn't communicate well with you on the phone is unlikely to be the best provider of deposition-services. Confirming that their court reporters are certified can also provide attorneys some insight into their court reporters skill levels.
- **Logistics and Availability:** Does the court reporting firm provide litigation support in the geographic areas needed? Are they able to meet the scheduling requirements for the job at hand?
- Services Provided: Arguably the most important questions that attorneys and support staff need to ask involve the portfolio of services provided. Do they offer realtime court reporting? Do they provide legal video services? Do they offer access to an online transcript repository? Can they provide videoconferencing? What services are included with every transcript package, and will there be additional fees for other specific services?

While hiring a court reporting services firm in Houston may seem like a daunting task, an organized approach can replace much of the uncertainty with the type of clarity that attorneys need to make the right choice from the many litigation support providers available. Attorneys simply need to remember that there is no such thing as asking too many questions, and that focusing on areas that apply directly to their case is an excellent way to end up with a court reporter that fits their needs perfectly.
