New South Wales

28 March 2014 - [Plowman v Sisters of St John of God Inc \[2014\] NSWSC 333](#)

St John of God Hospital applied to the New South Wales Supreme Court for an order requiring a plaintiff to submit to a blood test.

The hospital is the defendant in proceedings in which the plaintiff alleges she suffers from cerebral palsy and intellectual disability resulting from birth asphyxia caused by the negligence of the hospital.

The hospital sought an order requiring the plaintiff to have a blood test for the purposes of undertaking Array Comparative Genomic Hybridisation testing, which would determine if the plaintiff would have suffered intellectual deficits from genetic causes regardless of the alleged negligence. It argued that the results of this test would have a fundamental role in determining an issue of substance in the proceedings. The defendant argued that the order would be inappropriate, as the plaintiff has a number of phobias and anxieties related to seeing medical practitioners and having needles.

The Court made the requested order. It was satisfied that there is an issue of substance which will be illuminated by the results of the test. In this case, the testing has the capacity to identify underlying genetic alteration (a reasonable alternate explanation for the intellectual disability), which in turn may affect quantum. The Court was not satisfied that anxiety or phobias were a sufficient reason against making the order as they believed these could be appropriately managed.

The Court ordered the plaintiff to submit for a blood test within 28 days.

28 March 2014 - [Janet Harris v Sydney Local Health District \[2014\] NSWDC 21](#)

The plaintiff suffers on going infection of the ear, swelling, pain, dizziness and disorientation following treatment she received in the Emergency Department of the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital for preauricular cellulitis. The plaintiff alleges this was caused by the negligence of the hospital in failing to ensure that an ear wick they had inserted during treatment was removed and by failing to follow up when she failed to attend a scheduled appointment. The hospital denied they were negligent, contending they acted in a manner which was widely accepted by peer profession opinion as competent professional practice.

The District Court found the hospital breached its duty of care by failing to advise more clearly of the need for the plaintiff to return for removal of the wick and warn of the consequences if she failed to do so. Based on expert evidence, the Court considered that this deviated from what is widely accepted as competent professional practice. The Court determined the risk of ear infection was a foreseeable one and, in the circumstances, the relevant duty of care extended to taking positive steps to avoid the risk of harm because of the plaintiff's history of multiple incidents of hospitalisation for the same condition and vulnerability due to a known dependency problem with opioids and other drugs.

The Court did not accept the claim by the plaintiff that her relapse into heroin use was caused by the negligence of the hospital.

The Court assessed damages as totalling \$31,057.

New Zealand

[1] This appeal concerns a treatment injury claim. The basis for the claim is a delay in correct diagnosis of cauda equina syndrome and failure to provide treatment in a timely manner. [2] The appellant had a chronic back condition. On 2 July 2010, he developed symptoms of spinal cord compression and was referred for an MRI scan by Christchurch Radiology Group (GRG). The scan was conducted on the morning of 2 July. Radiology staff did not identify symptoms of possible cauda equina syndrome, in particular symptoms of loss of bladder sensation and function that would have required further examination and diagnosis. The appellant says that he had those symptoms at the time of his MRI scan but was sent home, where he was attended by his GP but not admitted to hospital. St John Ambulance services were called in the very early hours of 4 July. Fully developed symptoms of cauda equina syndrome were diagnosed at 4.50 am and the appellant was admitted to surgery for decompression of his L3/4 disc. He did not fully recover and suffered paralysis. [3] The respondent says that a diagnosis of cauda equina syndrome was not reasonably possible in the circumstances in which the appellant presented, until the early hours of 4 July. The appellant says that he presented with the symptoms at the time of the MRI scan in the morning of 2 July, and that timely treatment would have significantly improved his outcome. [4] A central part of the evidence concerns the appellant's general practitioner. The appellant does not directly allege medical negligence on the part of his general practitioner, but says that in hindsight all the signs were there at a critical time and he should have been admitted urgently to Christchurch Hospital. As the general practitioner was not notified as a party entitled to be heard in the appeal, she will be afforded anonymity and described as Dr A, the initial A not being the true initial of her surname.
