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JUDGMENTS

Queensland

30 July 2014 - Medical Board of Australia v Andersen [2014] QCAT 374

Dr Andersen engaged in a series of conduct in which he inappropriately prescribed products containing pseudoephedrine. He admitted that this series of conduct amounted to professional misconduct and conceded to the Tribunal that he should be the subject of a disciplinary sanction.

Andersen and the Medical Board of Australia jointly proposed orders, including the order that Dr Andersen's registration be suspended for a period of one month. The proposed orders provided for the suspension itself to be wholly suspended for a period of 12 months, during which Dr Andersen must not be the subject of any disciplinary action by the Board or the Tribunal.

The Tribunal noted it ought to only depart from a proposed sanction agreed between the parties if the proposed sanction falls outside of the permissible range of sanction for the conduct. In this case, the proposition to suspend the suspension was beyond the permissible range as it was not authorised by the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (Queensland).

The parties did not identify any basis on which the Tribunal could suspend the suspension of a registrant's registration and so the Tribunal did not grant the twelve-month suspension proposed. However, it found that it was appropriate to give Dr Andersen a period during which to make arrangements for his practice for the period of his suspension. The suspension was therefore suspended for a period of one month.

New South Wales (NSW)

14 August 2014 - TB and DC v State of New South Wales & Anor [2014] NSWSC 1145

The Supreme Court of NSW considered whether certain paragraphs of a medical report tendered by the plaintiff were admissible, following an objection by the defendants.

The Court held that paragraph 2 of the report was inadmissible because it disclosed the course of a confidential mediation. It is well established at law that the course of a confidential mediation must not be disclosed and accordingly, this was not a contentious issue in this case.

The defendants also argued that paragraphs 3 and 4 of the report were inadmissible because those paragraphs made assumptions about one of the plaintiff's (TB's) history, and those assumptions were not supported by evidence in the report. The defendants argued that where it is clear that there will be no evidence supporting the assumptions made by an expert, the recounting of those assumptions in the expert's report should be rejected. That is, the rules of evidence would not permit them to be admitted as "evidence of fact".

The Court upheld the defendants' objection to paragraphs 3 and 4 of the report. In doing so, it firstly accepted that the assumptions were not evidence of fact because they were not supported by evidence in the report. Secondly, it held that because the assumptions in paragraphs 3 and 4 were consistent with other evidence produced to the court, they were not necessary to prove the expert's opinion and were therefore also not admissible as 'opinion evidence.'
