D.C. Council set to vote on green building act fixes

The D.C. Council will take up emergency fixes to the Green Building Act in early December, hoping to stave off what developers warn could be a crushing blow to the District's construction pipeline. The final phase of the five-year-old law kicks in Jan. 1, affecting all nonresidential new construction and major renovations larger than 50,000 square feet.

UCI earns LEED Platinum

UC Irvine Today - Nov 22

UC Irvine earned its first LEED Platinum certification with its Humanities Gateway building. UCI already has eight LEED Gold certifications for other buildings on campus. The project features (1) a cool roof; (2) high-efficiency elevators; (3) construction waste recycling; (4) natural ambient lighting; and (5) ultra-low energy use.

L.A.'s Aircraft Rescue facility earns LEED Gold

World Interior Design Network - Nov 22

The Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting facility at Los Angeles International Airport in California earned LEED Gold certification and features (1) low-flow plumbing; (2) a high-performance HVAC; (3) occupancy-sensor lighting; (4) low VOC paints, adhesives and sealants; (5) use of recycled materials; and (6) recycling 99% of construction waste.

Santa Clara University earns LEED Gold

Business Wire / Santa Clara University - Nov 21

Santa Clara University's <u>Paul Locatelli Student Activity Center</u> earned LEED Gold and features (1) trellises and overhangs to reduce direct solar gain; (2) use of mortar-free pavers and decomposed granite to reduce water runoff; (3) low VOC paints, coatings and adhesives; (4) green certified carpets; and (5) recycling, waste and composting bins.

Sammons Cancer Center earns LEED Gold

World Interior Design Network - Nov 25

The Charles A. Sammons Cancer Center at Baylor University Medical Centre in Dallas, Texas earned LEED Gold and features (1) 14% less energy consumption; (2) 30% less water consumption; (3) a white roof; (4) 21% reclaimed materials for the core shell; and (5) low VOC materials.

Frito-Lay earns LEED NC Gold in Hawaii

Frito-Lay - Nov 22

Frito-Lay's distribution facility in Oahu, Hawaii earned LEED Gold and features (1) energy management systems; (2) photovoltaics; (3) energy efficient windows and skylights; (4) light colored paving to reduce the heat island effect; (5) reserved parking for carpools; and (6) high efficiency LED lighting.
