Cuts in 'green building' stimulus package

Market Watch - Feb 7

\$2 billion from a program for energy-efficient federal buildings was among the cuts in a compromise economic stimulus package reached by Senate negotiators. The compromise reached this week cut billions in spending from an earlier version of the \$800 billion-plus economic recovery package.

New LEED concrete calculator

Associated Construction Publications - Feb 4

The <u>National Ready Mixed Concrete Association</u> has introduced the Recycled Content and Regional Material Calculator, an Excel-based program which calculates concrete's contribution to the LEED 2.2 and LEED 2009 Recycled Content and Regional Material credits. The calculator allows input on project details, concrete producers and other applicable information. The program provides the results in a single page letter which can be provided to the LEED Accredited Professional, project manager or building owner.

ANSI approves "Nat'l Green Building Standard"

NAHB - Jan 29

The National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) and the NAHB Research Center learned on Jan. 29, 2009 that the National Green Building Standard[™] for single-family homes, apartments and condos, residential remodeling and renovation has been approved by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI). This establishes the NAHB's National Green Building Standard as the first and only ANSI-approved green building rating system, making it the benchmark for green homes.

New IT energy efficiency metrics

Green Grid, a consortium of technology companies focused on energy efficiency metrics for the IT industry, will launch Datacenter 2.0, as a design guide for energy-efficiency computing facilities. The Green Grid also recently released a white paper, called "Proxies for Estimating Data Center Productivity."

Smart Brief - Feb 6

This 2008 annual white paper from the nonprofit Leonardo Academy examines the cost of implementing LEED for Existing Buildings and the cost of operating such buildings. This study found that total costs were about \$1.50 to \$2.00 per square foot for LEED certification but that operating costs tended to be lower than average based on BOMA statistics.

Loan program to boost green building

However, because of the <u>credit crisis</u> and the broader economic downturn, current installations of wind and solar power is plummeting.

Green-washing in building industry

Experts allege that certain buildings registered for LEED or similar certification are increasingly being promoted as green using exaggerated or misleading claims. Examples include claiming that a property has earned LEED certification when it has not, or implying that certification is guaranteed when it may be uncertain. Further, sometimes certified buildings are depicted as environmentally and financially superior to other buildings without credible evidence.

Green building codes use LEED

More cities across the U.S. are attempting to reduce carbon emissions and their environmental impact by instituting green building codes. For example, Los Angeles, San Francisco and Washington D.C. have all introduced green building mandates. Although each mandate is somewhat different, most have settled on the USGBC's 'LEED' certification as the standard for defining green and sustainable construction.

REI, an outdoor gear and clothing retailer, learned that its prototype store in Boulder, Colorado has been awarded LEED Gold certification from the USGBC. REI Boulder is a remodeled store, and serves as REI's first prototype location, designed to improve the in-store experience and reduce its environmental footprint by focusing on energy efficiency, water conservation, and the use of recycled and renewable materials, among other things.

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
