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How to Respond to a Search Warrant: Ten Practical Steps

- 1. Try to remain calm.
- 2. Contact a lawyer. If you can't reach an attorney immediately, contact a designated managerial employee who is the point person to interact with law enforcement for the search warrant.
- 3. Ask the agents for identification, who is in charge of the search, and for contact information for agents on the scene. Make notes.
- 4. Ask for a copy of the search warrant and attachment and review them.
- 5. Make notes describing the documents and items seized by law enforcement.
- 6. Do not give consent to search extra areas without conferring with an attorney. If you are unable to reach an attorney, do not give consent.
- 7. Be calm, courteous and professional with law enforcement; do not obstruct.
- 8. Advise employees of their rights. Consider sending non-essential employees home.
- 9. Get a copy of the search warrant inventory and provide it to counsel.
- 10. Don't be surprised if you get a "clean up" subpoena. Provide that to counsel promptly.
