From a legal documentation perspective, the Klingon language has an alphabet of 26 characters, a positional numeric writing system with 10 digits, and is written left-to-right, top-to-bottom. The standard Okrand transliteration for Klingon can viewed at the Conscript Unicode Registry website.¹

More about Porcine Latin for Earth-Bound Legal Professionals

Porcine Latin is a language derived from a game of alterations using the English Language. To form the Porcine Latin form of an English word the initial consonant sound is transposed to the end of the word and an *ay* is affixed (Ex.: "integrated platform" would yield *integratedway atformplay*). The purpose of the alteration is to both obfuscate the encoding and to indicate for the intended recipient the encoding as 'Pig Latin'.²
