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JUDGMENTS

New South Wales

12 June 2014 - Rosten v Mid North Coast Local Health District [2014] NSWIRComm 29

This was an unfair dismissal claim made by a nurse against a hospital heard by the New South Wales (NSW) Industrial Relations Commission. The nurse was summarily terminated from her employment at the hospital on the basis of misconduct.

The hospital had formed the view that the nurse had abused a patient by slapping her across the face twice, manually handling the patient in a rough and uncaring manner and referred to her in a derogatory manner during a night shift. The nurse denies that these events occurred and asserted the patient was mistaken in her complaint. The decision maker of the hospital acknowledged he had accepted the information made in the complaint without an independent inquiry and had not seen the complete medical records.

The Commission found on the balance of probabilities that the nurse did not abuse the patient because of the absence of any sign of injury to the patient, the lack of complaint by her to the examining doctor, the continual calling for her daughter through the night, the propensity to delusional experience, the absence of any reaction by the patient to the alleged slap, the inherent unlikelihood that if a nurse lost her temper she would slap an aged patient twice in the same manner and the uncertainty of time and location of the alleged offence.

Therefore, the Commission determined the termination of the nurse's employment was harsh, unreasonable and unjust and ordered she be reinstated with no loss of wages or continuity of service.

Western Australia

10 June 2014 - PW v MS [No 3] [2014] WASC 202

The plaintiff is the former de facto partner of the defendant. He claims that the defendant maliciously made false statements about him to a General Practitioner and staff at a medical clinic to the effect that he was sexually and physically abusing and neglecting their child. The plaintiff claims that these statements were republished by the Child Protection Unit by way of referral. The defendant denied she made the alleged statements or she did so maliciously and does did not agree that the GP republished the statements.

The Supreme Court of Western Australia dismissed the plaintiff's action because he could not show that he suffered any injury from the statements. However, the Court agreed that the statements were false as there were no reasonable grounds to suspect or believe that the plaintiff had sexually or physically abused or neglected the child. The Court inferred that the statements were malicious as the defendant did not say under oath, despite opportunity, that she was worried for the welfare of the child.

The Court was of the opinion that there was no evidence to establish that the statements were republished by the GP or any other staff at the medical clinic. The decision did not the address the issue of whether statements made to a medical practitioner reproduced in a referral to a child protection organisation could be considered "published" to satisfy the element of the tort of malicious falsehood.
