## Court Funding Cuts Suggest Need For Better Business Planning

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The bad news for court funding in California continues. According to the <u>Sacramento Business Journal</u>, Governor Brown's May revision of the State budget includes a \$300 million cut in funding for trial courts and achieves further savings by delaying \$240 million in trial court construction.

Our <u>previous article</u> detailed the impact of budget cuts onLos Angeles area courts and commented on the increased role for alternative dispute resolution, such as mediation and arbitration, in such an environment.

But the best way for businesses to deal with funding cuts to the court system is to avoid disputes in the first place. This can be achieved through effective business planning and execution, including:

- Enhanced management and control of business contractors and vendors
- Increased due diligence in selection of contractors and vendors
