Construction Accident Severs Workers Hand, New York Construction Accident Lawyer Comments

NEW YORK, NEW YORK – A Thursday afternoon construction accident severed the hand of a construction worker on Staten Island. The horrific <u>New York construction</u> <u>accident</u> occurred at a home at 24 Kelvin St. in Bay Terrace around 5:30 p.m., reported the *New York Post*.

According to sources, Steven Selva, 20, was doing outside repairs when he <u>fell from a ladder</u> and a power saw cut off his left hand at the wrist. It was a <u>construction site ladder fall</u> of approximately 20 feet.

"Falls from ladders and <u>cutting accidents</u> are unfortunately two common types of <u>construction accidents in New York</u> and elsewhere, although they're generally preventable when safe procedures are abided by," said <u>New York construction accident lawyer</u> David Perecman.
