Undisclosed Risks

When you're not informed of the side effects of a drug, the risks a certain product presents or other hazards, you cannot make an informed decision and you have the right to make an informed decision when you buy or use a product. Remember that the company cannot get off the hook simply because they are very large and powerful.

Settlements

If you're offered a settlement by a company that you're considering filing a lawsuit against, remember that the settlement may have been arrived at by the company because they believe it's the very least amount of money that you'll be satisfied with. They may not actually be trying to make the situation right. Quite the opposite, in fact, may be the case. Be sure you speak with an attorney before you accept any such settlement.
