## Freight Elevator Falls 3 Floors, New York Personal Injury Lawyer Says Elevator Accidents More Common Than People Think

## Nearly two dozen men were injured in an elevator accident when a freight elevator malfunctioned in Chelsea.

NEW YORK, NEW YORK – A freight elevator malfunctioned and crashed into a basement in Chelsea, according to the *New York Post*. Four people were seriously hurt and ten others suffered minor injuries in the <u>New York elevator accident</u>.

"Although not as common as construction accidents or auto accidents, <u>elevator accidents</u> resulting in injury or death happen more often than people think," New York personal injury lawyer David Perecman said.

As reported, the elevator suddenly plunged three floors shortly before 7 a.m. It was carrying 24 men, all construction workers.

The <u>elevator accident</u> occurred at the Bed, Bath and Beyond on Sixth Avenue near West 19<sup>th</sup> Street.

As reported, the Buildings Department discovered that a faulty elevator brake was defective, which caused the elevator accident. The DOB issued a violation to the owner because the freight elevator was not even supposed to be carrying passengers.

"Elevators need to be maintained and serviced on a regular basis. Many times, <u>elevator</u> <u>accidents</u> occur because of negligence in the maintenance of the elevator in New York," personal injury lawyer Perecman said.
