

Drug Injury Watch: Increasing Number Of Pradaxa Lawsuits Against Boehringer Are Consolidated In Federal Court MDL

This Pradaxa MDL Case Will Include Gastrointestinal Bleeding And Other Hemorrhages As Well As Heart Attacks Or Myocardial Infarctions

SUMMARY: Federal court Pradaxa MDL established in August 2012 is assigned to Judge David Herndon in the Southern District of Illinois.

Pradaxa is a blood-thinning drug from Boehringer which has been linked to serious bleeding events and hemorrhages such as hemorrhagic stroke as well as heart attacks or myocardial infarctions (MI) and acute coronary syndrome (ACS).
