Argosy University Scam

Argosy University located in Dallas, Texas has been under fire for providing diplomas as an accredited school, when in fact the university is not American Psychological Association (APA) accredited by any means. Some students have gone as far to say the university is a "useless diploma mill" and a "scam school" that should be avoided at all costs.

Beginning in 2009, lawsuits were filed by students of Argosy University in Dallas who believed that university recruiters inaccurately informed students that the school was pending accreditation from the APA. The students filing the lawsuit had received diplomas before the school had completed the accreditation process. At the time of the lawsuit itself, the school had not applied for APA accreditation.

Argosy University's parent company, EDMC, responded with the lawsuit by saying that accreditation with the APA is not required for clinical psychology licensure in some jurisdictions in Texas. As of 2013, Argosy University does not offer any degrees in clinical psychology and the program is not listed in the university's College of Clinical Psychology.

Despite being ranked 30th in Guide to Online School's "2012 Online College Rankings", and 272nd by high school counselors in U.S. News and World Report's Best Colleges Rankings, the school was one of fifteen named for deception in a Government Accountability Office report in 2010.

Additionally, Argosy University has received lawsuits in other states for falsely certifying education management and doctoring student enrollment numbers to qualify to receive student financial aid. To date, the university is still not accredited by the APA at the Dallas location.
