

Best Practices for Attorneys Participating in Realtime Depositions

Technology has introduced a number of great <u>litigation support</u> tools over the past decade, but arguably the innovation that offers the most value for attorneys is the use of realtime <u>depositions</u>. Proper Preparation

Take a little bit of time to become comfortable with the user interface, so that when you need to make notes, or highlight segments of the transcript, you won't be fumbling around trying to remember which button to click.

Loading Unique Words

Every case has specific words and terms that can sometimes trip up <u>court reporters</u>. Difficult last names, locations and technical terminology can cause misspellings in the transcript, which can severely inhibit the attorney's ability to search through the transcript for those terms while the depositions are in progress. By providing a word list to your realtime court reporter, preferably well ahead of the court proceedings, you increase the overall accuracy of the deposition transcript. Your court reporter will definitely appreciate the extra effort on your part.

Imagine the Possibilities

Attorneys using realtime court reporting for the first time rarely capitalize on all the various features and advantages these online <u>litigation services</u> can provide. Are other members of your legal team in remote locations? Could streaming those depositions to the offsite team members make them more efficient in their case-related tasks? By taking the time to review all of those realtime options and benefits, you stand a better chance of getting the most out of them.

Realtime depositions can go a long way toward saving the attorney time and money, plus allow for the greatest chance of providing better service to the client.
