Scaffolding Collapse in Yonkers Watched Live by New York Scaffold Accident Lawyer

Two construction workers are rescued by firemen after a scaffold collapses 100 feet above the ground; New York scaffold accident lawyer David Perecman watched the incident unfold from the near beginning.

NEW YORK, NEW YORK — Two construction workers were hanging on for their lives Friday afternoon after their scaffold collapsed at a Yonkers high-rise. They were left dangling more than 100 feet above the ground. New Yorkers, including <u>New York scaffold accident lawyer</u> David Perecman, were riveted by the rescue drama as it unfolded live on TV and the Internet.

The construction workers were rescued by firefighters more than an hour and a half after a rope snapped on their platform, flipping it into a vertical position.

A specially trained firefighter rappelled down the side of the building twice — one time for each painter.

Safety harnesses likely saved the construction workers from plunging down more than 12 stories while they waited to be rescued. The causes of the scaffolding accident in Yonkers, New York is still unknown.

"<u>Scaffolding accidents</u> can happen for many different reasons. Fortunately, these men were wearing their safety harnesses. It appeared they were both in extreme danger and that this precaution saved their lives," said New York <u>scaffold accident lawyer</u> Perecman.

Perecman recalls a case he handled where two men died and two were injured because of a windstorm that violently shook a suspended scaffold in New York. The scaffolding accident lawyer represented the one man that didn't fall but hung on to the scaffold during the storm and watched as the others fell. <u>Perecman</u> <u>settled the construction worker's case just before trial for \$2,143,000.00</u>. This was compensation for the worker's psychological injury, a type of post traumatic stress disorder.

Construction workers who work on scaffolding are always at risk of suffering serious injuries from falling or other <u>construction related accidents</u>. According to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), falls from heights are the leading cause of construction industry injury in the U.S.
