Ygrene Energy Fund provides private funding, rather than government bonds, to finance Property Assessed Clean Energy ("PACE") programs across the country. Ygrene is backed by Barclays Capital, Lockheed Martin, Hannover Re and British billionaire Richard Branson's Carbon War Room. Through government-assisted financing for green retrofits — PACE programs provide low interest loans for insulation, efficient cooling systems, solar electric generation, etc., for commercial and residential projects. PACE loans are secured through property taxes and are available in over 22 states.

Syracuse Center earns LEED Platinum

The Syracuse Center of Excellence in Syracuse, New York, earned LEED Platinum certification and features (1) radiant ceilings; (2) high-efficiency auto-dimming lighting; (3) insulated-glass windows; (4) a reflective roof; (5) underfloor ventilation; and (6) a storm-water retention tank.

Ramona Library earns LEED Gold

Ramona Library, built by C.W. Driver, earned LEED Gold certification and features (1) a photovoltaic system producing 20% of the library's needs; (2) a digital display showing energy consumption and production; (3) native plants; and (4) low-flow plumbing.

University of Wyoming earns LEED Gold

University of Wyoming - Sep 23

The U of W College of Business earned LEED Gold certification and features (1) 95% construction recycling; (2) 10% recycled content for the new building; (3) 90% of storm water treatment; (4) native and drought-tolerant plants to reduce water usage by 50%; and (5) significant energy savings.

KFC in Indianapolis earns LEED Gold

A KFC restaurant in Indiana earned LEED Gold as part of KFC's global environmental stewardship effort. The project features (1) 25% less energy and water usage than a conventional KFC restaurant; (2) energy-efficient cooking equipment; (3) LED lighting; (4) locally-sourced building materials; and (5) waste recycling for cooking oil and plastic.
