Bronx Construction Accident Lawyer at The Perecman Firm Calls for Greater Construction Site Safety Following Fatal Building Collapse

NEW YORK , NEW YORK – A construction worker died when a two-story commercial building under construction in the Bronx collapsed.

Muhamed Kebbeh died in the <u>Bronx construction accident</u> after getting buried under six feet of bricks and other debris, reported *The New York Times*.

A co-worker said they were jackhammering the floor when "everything fell down."

The roof crashed down after two construction workers cut into the cement floor around a support beam, according to the *New York Daily News*.

"A construction accident can occur in the blink of an eye, with life-threatening or lifechanging consequences," said David Perecman, a <u>Bronx construction accident lawyer</u> with over 30 years of experience handling construction accident matters. "Construction workers in New York and elsewhere face a greater risk of work-related injury or death than employees in any other industry."

According to *The New York Times*, approximately a dozen pillars in the basement gave way and caused the building to collapse. Two other construction workers escaped the Bronx construction accident without injury, a New York Police Department spokesman said.

Kebbeh died at Jacobi Medical Center shortly after the Bronx construction accident.

The New York Buildings Department issued a full-stop work order and was in the process of issuing violations to the contractors for working after hours without a permit, reported the *New York Post*.

"Chances are this tragic construction accident in the Bronx could have been avoided through effective safety measures," said <u>Bronx construction accident lawyer</u> Perecman, founder of The Perecman Firm, one of New York's construction accident law firms. "However, even when all safety rules are followed, construction accidents can and will happen."
