New York Personal Injury Lawyer Probes Cause of Second Tour Bus Accident

Investigators and New York bus accident lawyer David Perecman seek answers on a second fatal bus crash.

NEW YORK, NEW YORK – Police are investigating a fatal bus accident on the New Jersey Turnpike that occurred two days after a <u>New York bus accident</u> killed fifteen people in the Bronx. The latest bus accident killed the driver and a passenger.

After examining the initial reports regarding both bus accidents, <u>New York bus accident</u> <u>lawyer</u> David Perecman concludes that bus drivers must be screened and trained better.

"Bus companies are obliged to better protect their passengers," New York bus accident lawyer Perecman said.

In this <u>bus accident</u>, the driver, was not wearing his seat belt as required by law, said New Jersey State Police. Wei Wang died on the roadside after being thrown through the windshield of the luxury charter tour bus.

Apparently, the bus rolled onto the grass along the center median of the highway before striking a concrete overpass support and hitting an embankment. When it came to a stop, the front part of the bus pointed off the road and onto the grassy median.

Approximately 40 passengers were injured badly enough in the <u>bus accident</u> to be sent to area hospitals. Two were reported to be in critical condition.

That bus, which was going from Manhattan for Philadelphia, was operated by Super Luxury Tours. According to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, Super Luxury Tours has been flagged repeatedly for the condition of its buses and the qualifications of its drivers.

This second bus accident came as federal crash investigators are still investigating the cause of the tour <u>bus accident in New York</u> that killed 15 of its passengers. In the New York bus accident, the driver is believed to have concealed his criminal record and driving history in order to obtain his bus license.

"Injured <u>bus accident victims</u> and their loved ones can often expect <u>compensation</u> from a bus company found at fault for failure to properly screen their bus drivers. It is a company's responsibility to properly screen, test and qualify drivers. A bus company is also responsible for making sure drivers do not operate a bus while fatigued," said New York bus accident lawyer Perecman.
