As the number of LEED buildings rises, so does the number of failed LEED projects. The potential liabilities involved in failed LEED projects covers new legal ground, largely because there has yet to be a court ruling to set a precedent. LEED projects require clear communication and unambiguous allocations of contractual risks to be successful.

The Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) voted to set more stringent green requirements: developers receiving \$1 million or more in CRA funding must meet higher environmental standards than the Green Building Program calls for through water- and energy-saving systems, recycled building materials and other strategies.

Many building owners are implementing green building upgrades in hopes of attracting new tenants and retaining existing tenants. For example, the Empire State Building and the Sears Tower have already begun extensive green renovations.

"LEED-Like" terminology being used

Globe and Mail - July 3

In Canada, some developers are using terms such as "LEED-like" to describe projects that may aim to be green but have not achieved LEED certification. Those using such terminology without permission will receive a call from the CaGBC to either register the project or remove references to LEED. Since February 2002, 154 buildings across Canada have gained LEED certification. However, CaGBC found about 10

projects using the LEED wording without permission.

Hotel Indigo San Diego designated San Diego's first LEED-certified hotel

InterContinental Hotels Group - July 13

Hotel Indigo San Diego Gaslamp Quarter is the first LEED certified hotel in San Diego - one of only 19 in the U.S. It is also the only new hotel scheduled to open in downtown San Diego in 2009.

Chipotle -- first LEED Platinum restaurant

Greener Buildings - July 9

Chipotle Mexican Grill earned LEED Platinum in Illinois. Using the LEED for Retail pilot program, Chipotle is the first restaurant to receive Platinum certification. Its green features include LED lighting, water-saving faucets and toilets, and energy Star-rated kitchen equipment.

Center for Architecture earns LEED Platinum

Portland Business Journal - July 2

The Center for Architecture in Portland, Oregon, generates its own energy, increases lighting efficiency, and uses recycled materials to reduce its carbon footprint by 82%. These features helped the center earn LEED Platinum.

The Fairmont Hotels & Resorts is adding eco-friendly IT strategies to its green program. The IT component is intended to conserve energy, promote responsible purchasing, cut waste and help shrink the company's carbon footprint.
