## Clean Energy Ministerial sparks 11 U.S. initiatives

Energy Boom - Jul 22

The world's first international Clean Energy Ministerial sparked the U.S. to launch 11 clean energy initiatives such as cutting energy waste, deploying a smart grid, using electric vehicles, and implementing carbon capture technologies. The initiatives hope to eliminate the need for 500 new mid-sized power plants in the next 20 years.

A study by the Northeast Ohio chapter of the USGBC and Sustainable Rhythm found 62% of respondents perceived a significant cost difference between green buildings and standard buildings, 26% perceived no significant cost difference, and 12% were unsure.

#### Irvine's first park gets green makeover

OC Register - Jul 30

University Community Park, a 16-acre park first build in 1976, will reopen after an 18-month, \$6.5 million green retrofit. The LEED certified park features: (1) recycled materials, including recycled denim jean insulation in the community building, (2) solar panels providing 5% of energy needs, (3) stainable materials including bamboo exercise flooring, (4) drought tolerant plants with recycled rubber mulch, (5) high-efficiency irrigation, (6) shade trees near heat absorbing paved areas, and (7) rainwater capture. City leaders had adopted a green building program five years ago that included renovating or building any municipal buildings larger than 5,000 square feet to top environmental standards
