Green construction to hit \$173.5 B by 2015

An EL Insights study predicts that the U.S. green building market will grow to \$173.5 billion by 2015. This growth represents a compounded annually growth rate of 19.5%. Also, the study predicts green construction will create 2.5 million U.S. jobs or, in other words, a 30% increase in construction industry jobs.

Study: Green building costs -- perception vs. reality

Sustainable Rhythm - Jun 18

A study by the USGBC Northeast Ohio Chapter and Sustainable Rhythm finds a chasm between perception and reality. While recent data shows green projects can be built for little or no increase in construction costs, such data is not being communicated effectively since 62% of those surveyed believe there are significant costs increases for green construction over traditional construction and 46% believed such added green building costs exceed 10%.
