## Getting Help With Elder Abuse

People are sometimes too ready to credit anyone with medical certification. This is oftentimes the most powerful way for truly disgraceful people to hide the abuse they visit on others. <u>Senior abuse</u> is far too commonly seen and some of its consequences can be deadly. It doesn't always take forms that are easy to detect. A few of the warnings of elder abuse that may shock you include:

- Sudden change of personality or cognitive function
- Issues with memory and emotional fits that are not usual for the victim
- Major depressions and a disinterest in visitors
- Nervousness and panic that are not usual for the individual
- Dirty fingernails, toenails and teeth
- Poor hygiene

The deceitful thing about elder abuse is that lots of its signals are very closely related to those of advanced, age-related illnesses. The fundamental key to recognizing them is that they tend to be somewhat alarming. Oftentimes, nursing home abuse ends in something feeling wrong about your loved one; you may not be able to say what, but something is not right. It's also a scenario that requires you to consider all the evidence rather than just looking for one tell-tale sign.

The mental issues associated with elder abuse normally include depression, anxiety, and a near catatonia. These mental illnesses oftentimes are the aftermath of an elder being over-medicated. Nursing homes with unqualified and immoral people on staff will sometimes do this to simply make caring for the patients less of a hassle. If you suspect that your loved one is being over-medicated by inadequately trained or unethical staff members, you should contact an outside doctor to receive immediate relief. You should also consider that over-medicated is simply a nicer term for overdosed, and that should clarify to you exactly how dangerous nursing home mistreatment can be. The sooner you seek help, the better.

If you suspect that your loved one is in a dangerous situation, you need to immediately remove them from the facility.
