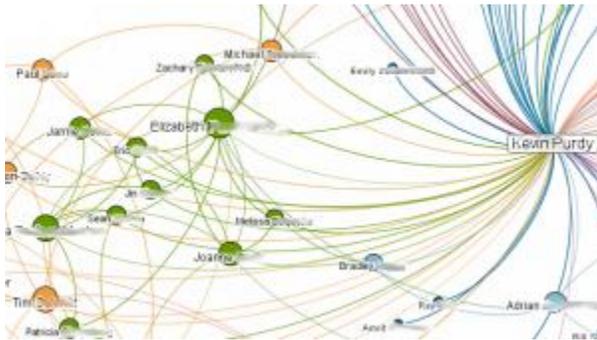


LinkedIn InMaps Offers a BIG Picture of Your Network

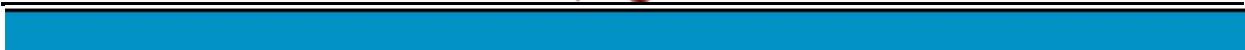
The professional social networking site is helping us visualize our networks with what they call [InMaps](#).

LinkedIn launched InMaps in January as an experimental project that lets users visualize the connections within their professional networks. InMaps technology filters through a users connections to see how everyone knows each other – and then groups people together into network clusters based on their associations.

InMaps can show you who the major connections and influencers are in your network. People with bigger dots and larger fonts have more connections – and typically more influence.
