In other situations, there may be a modeling defect that brings about a product liability lawsuit. The most discussed situation that most people most likely recollect involves the Ford Pinto. The machine ended up being vulnerable to catching fire when hit from behind. This resulted in deaths and, ultimately, it was found out that the corporation, Ford, knew of the safety issues and didn't do anything to fix the problem.
