SUMMARY: From the Bayer Stockholders' Newsletter for Second quarter of 2013 we know that as of July 8, 2013 the number of unresolved pending DVT and PE blood clot-related lawsuits or claims subject to a so-called "tolling agreement" has increased by about 300 since April 15, 2013, which indicates that new cases are still being filed by women who used one of the drospirenone (DRSP) birth control pills made by Bayer, which are YAZ, Yasmin, Ocella, Gianvi, Beyaz, and Safvral.

It appears that thus far Bayer has been settling only YAZ, Yasmin, Ocella, and certain Gianvi cases. It is expected, however, that Bayer will begin to settle Beyaz and Safyral cases in the relatively near future.
