Epidural steroid injections are used to treat degenerative disc disease, bulging discs, and disc herniation. They are the most commonly used intervention in the United States to manage chronic and subacute low back and neck pain with radiculopathy.

Epidural injections are most often performed by a pain management specialist, and this is often a anesthesiologist with additional training in pain management. Neurologists also sometimes perform this procedure. The therapeutic effects of these injections often reduce the pain and symptomology suffered by the patient. However, like most medical procedures, there are risks inherent to the procedure.

Risks of epidural injections include stroke, nerve, damage, and even death. Although these risks can occur when the doctor properly performs the procedure, they are often the result of medical negligence. An improperly placed needle can cause catastrophic consequences to the patient and may give rise to a medical malpractice lawsuit.

If you or someone you know has suffered a stroke after an epidural injection or some other serious injury, you should have the medical records reviewed by our experienced medical malpractice lawyers. We will review the chart of the physician who performed the procedure along with the medical chart of the care providers providing medical treatment after the injury.
