Deaths Prompt Another Stroller Recall

As a parent, you hold your baby close to your heart and you do your best to protect them, but when you find out that doing so may cause them danger, it's difficult to know what to do. Discovering that the stroller that has been carrying your child may in fact be fatal may be one of your concerns. The biggest fear for several parents may be product liabilities such as this.

To add to the list of concerns are the stroller recalls for Graco's older versions of Quattro Tour and Metrolite strollers and travel systems that have caused four infant deaths between 2003 and 2005. These deaths were the result of the infant being trapped between the stroller tray and bottom of the seat and interestingly enough, the strollers being recalled were developed before the development in 2008 of a voluntary standard that requires a larger stroller openings between the stroller's tray and seat bottom to prevent such accidents. The recall was announced by the Consumer Product Safety Commission on October 20, 2010 and may include up to 2 million strollers.

It may be tough to come to terms with yourself when your child dies or has been injured in your attempt to keep them safe, but the fault lies in the manufacturer. These companies have an obligation to ensure that their products are safe before they are released in the marketplace to prevent these very accidents from happening. Although it is unlikely that you will wholly recover from the death of your child, talking to a <u>product liability lawyer</u> may help.
