They may seem like they're being rude but truckers have the biggest vehicles on the road and, if you try to muscle them around, you'll lose every time.

You also need to be extra aware of what semis are doing. Watch them closely when the conditions are rainy or slippery. They may be struggling to keep the vehicle on the road and you need to be ready if they fail in that effort. If a truck needs to pull over or speed by you in an emergency, you need to give them plenty of clearance. If the roads are slippery and a trucker is driving very slowly ahead of you, stay well back. Wait for a safe opportunity to pass or just accept that your drive is going to take longer than you expected. Semis can jackknife in slippery conditions and you don't want to be anywhere near one if that happens. Truckers are paid to make their deliveries on time. If they're driving very slowly, you can be sure there's a good reason for it.
